Grant Summary

Crisis Response

Contract with Dr. Don Belau to continue to facilitate the Lancaster County Crisis Response. Dr. Belau will continue to facilitate and chair the crisis steering committee and the Lincoln/Lancaster Youth Crisis Response Committee. This includes evaluation of criteria/outcomes and surveys, identification of methods of marketing a positive response to utilize services, and develop awareness of help/text lines in the community.

Crisis Stabilization

CEDARS is actively working with juvenile justice, mental health and law enforcement officials in Lancaster County to provide Youth Crisis Continuum Services for up to 110 youth in need of supportive mental health services to assist them in achieving placement stability. As a community-based approach to mental health services, therapeutic groups and individual counseling are available to youth placed at CEDARS Pioneers Center Emergency Shelter and intensive stabilization services are available to identified youth and families for up to 21 days.

Take Pause 2.0

The Malone will expand their current cop club to educate and spread awareness of the good deeds and common ground between cops and community members to bridge relationships between cops and teens. The teen community members will meet bi-weekly to engage in activities and skill building opportunities that work to increase positive interactions with the police and teenagers of Lancaster county.

Malone Center Therapist

The Malone will have a dedicated therapist for youth available at the Malone Center. This therapist will address institutional trauma. Therapy will be delivered while interacting with the youth during various activities (gardening, basketball, etc).
