Advanced public notice of the meeting was posted on the County-City Building bulletin board, and the Lancaster County, Nebraska, website and emailed to media on June 2, 2021, and published in the Lincoln Journal Star print edition and website on May 31, 2021.

The Chair noted the location of the Open Meetings Act and opened the meeting at 8:33 a.m.

# AGENDA ITEM

# 1. APPROVAL OF STAFF MEETING MINUTES FOR MAY 27, 2021

**MOTION:** Schorr moved and Yoakum seconded approval of the May 27, 2021, Staff Meeting minutes. Amundson, Flowerday, Vest, Schorr and Yoakum voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

# 2. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE – Joe Kohout and Brennen Miller, Kissel, Kohout, ES Associates LLC

Kohout reviewed the weekly report (Exhibit 1), noting the pandemic-induced procedural changes during the year. While discussing the Board's priorities and the outcomes of each, Kohout said a meeting has been set for Douglas, Lancaster and Sarpy counties and the Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) to discuss the next legislative session.

Regarding LB271 (Adopt the 24/7 Sobriety Program Act), Kohout thanked Kim Etherton, Community Corrections Director; Pat Condon, County Attorney; and Joe Nigro, Public Defender; for all of their work on this bill.

Miller and Kohout discussed interim studies LR215 (Interim study to examine county fees and fines set by statute and the cost for administering the associated services) and LR186 (Interim study to examine nonprofit movie theaters and tax-exempt status) (Exhibit 2). Scott Gaines, Deputy County Assessor/Register of Deeds, noted there has been a long running tax dispute in Johnson County regarding non-profit theaters.

Kohout suggested the Board and lobbyists communicate what each body hears about legislative matters throughout the break.

Additionally, a comprehensive listing of bills (Exhibit 3) and a listing of the Board positions (Exhibit 4) were provided.

# 3. WITTSTRUCK ROAD 54TH – 68TH STREET – Pam Dingman, Lancaster County Engineer

Stanton Beeder, general counsel for Hausmann Construction, was available.

Dingman reviewed the request to pave Wittstruck Road from South 54<sup>th</sup> and South 68<sup>th</sup> Streets (Exhibits 5 and 6). Beeder added there has been a significant increase in traffic with the new subdivisions, and the residents feel the sightlines and current road features are unsafe, especially for the younger drivers in the area. He felt this project would have strong support from area residents. There is continued growth expected in the area. The paving would include additional safety features such as shoulders and improved grading. The cost is estimated at \$1,300,000 (Exhibit 7) with Joey Hausmann offering to pay for 50% of the paving needs.

When asked about a possible timeframe for the paving, Dingman said this project is only conceptual at this point and is not in the current budget request. Interlocal agreements and right-of-way contracts will be necessary to continue the project. It will take approximately two to three years to complete.

Yoakum asked if paved or gravel roads are more cost effective in long-term maintenance costs. Dingman answered pavement is essentially maintenance free for the first five years, and then there would be continued maintenance costs.

Schorr expressed concern about constituent questions on how a new project could be placed ahead of already planned projects, such as those included in the One and Six Road and Bridge Program.

**MOTION:** Schorr moved and Amundson seconded for the County Engineer to continue discussions with Hausmann Construction and report back to the Board with a final project recommendation.

Beeder confirmed that funding from private sources will be committed to the project.

Amundson inquired if Hausmann Construction is the primary developer in the area. Beeder answered Hausman Construction did develop some properties, but that other developers had built properties in the area.

Vest confirmed both South 54<sup>th</sup> Street and South 68<sup>th</sup> Street are already paved.

ROLL CALL: Amundson, Flowerday, Vest, Schorr and Yoakum voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

# 4. COVID-19 UPDATE AND RESPONSE

Flowerday stated Governor Ricketts is cutting federal funding to the public health departments. The Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department (LLCHD) is gathering information on the fiscal impact. More information will be shared when it is available.

It was the consensus of the Board to resume staff meetings in Room 113 with a date to be determined.

# DISCUSSION OF BOARD MEMBER MEETINGS ATTENDED

# A. Chamber Coffee – Vest / Schorr

Schorr reported there were updates on the legislative session, City of Lincoln and County initiatives, Lincoln Partnership for Economic Development (LPED) projects, and community events, including a gravel road bike race, the National High School Finals Rodeo, Lincoln Public Schools (LPS) and University of Nebraska-Lincoln graduations, and the Garth Brooks concert. Vest added the chicken farm court case and programs for youth and families were discussed. Also, a thank you to the community was extended for the support and leadership during the pandemic.

The meeting recessed at 9:30 a.m. and reconvened at 9:46 a.m.

# 5. VICTORY PARK UPDATE – Randy Jones, Director, Aging Partners

Jones reviewed a PowerPoint presentation (Exhibit 8).

The Board expressed their enthusiasm for the project.

Kay Wenzl, Aging Partners Program Manager; and Tim Sieh, City of Lincoln Senior Attorney; were available for the discussion.

# 7. **DEPARTMENT BUDGET HEARINGS** – Dennis Meyer, Budget and Fiscal Officer

# A. District Court – Jared Gavin, District Court Administrator

Gavin reported the District Court expenses are anticipated to be underbudget due to reduced attorney fees. He noted costs related to COVID-19 were higher than anticipated. There were not many jury trials last year due to the pandemic. Costs could increase this year with trials being held closer together due to statutory limitations on trials.

Expenses are increasing 4.87% (see agenda packet). The revenues are not expected to increase from the previous fiscal year. Gavin stated the largest costs are personnel and attorney fees.

When asked about position changes during the fiscal year, Gavin said there was a <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> work-release position that was lost. He would like to change the position to a full time equivalent (FTE) clerical position. He also requested an additional technical support position.

Gavin stated Information Services (IS) has been assisting him for two hours per day in troubleshooting technical issues throughout the courts. He said there is an ongoing list of emergency issues that have happened, most of them having to do with trials and equipment failures. Many of the issues are related to the State of Nebraska's equipment and private counsel bringing in outside

equipment, which the IS personnel are not able to fix. Gavin has pushed this issue with the State to fix the equipment; however, the State is refusing to come in unless labor and materials are covered by the County.

It was the consensus of the Board for the appropriate State representatives, David Young, Information Services Manager; Dave Derbin, Chief Administrative Officer; and the Courts to discuss equipment issues and find the best way to solve the malfunctions.

Schorr inquired which position, the clerical or the technical, would Gavin prioritize. He responded if the technology issues could be cleared up, he would prefer the clerical position be filled.

Meyer reviewed the technology fund request (see agenda packet). He noted upgraded speakers and microphones in the courtrooms have been built into the Building Fund.

Gavin stated the State technology network and State maintenance of such is an underfunded mandate.

# B. Risk Management – Sue Eckley, Director, Risk Management

# Workers Compensation

Eckley stated this year has had both fewer and less severe injury claims. She noted the Legislature passed LB255 (Adopt the In the Line of Duty Compensation Act) which could have an impact on the budget.

Schorr asked if the average age of County employees has decreased resulting in lower claim filings. Eckley answered she can run a report to verify that statistic. She felt the modified duty option for the jail has made a difference in the claim amounts.

Regarding unfunded and underfunded mandates, Eckley said the Nebraska Workers' Compensation Court mandates reporting which uses several different systems that do not communicate with each other. Because of this, there were IS costs incurred.

Eckley noted departments are billed for a representative percentage based on past claims and an actuarial report.

# Self-Insurance Fund

Meyer said expenses are increasing 5.17% and revenues are increasing 2.47% (see agenda packet). Eckley stated the County pays the first \$250,000 of each claim. There has not been much activity this past fiscal year. The fund balance will have \$3,000,000. The Sheriff Pursuit line will have \$950,000 and the Sheriff At Fault line will have \$250,000 at the end of the fiscal year.

# C. Human Services / General Assistance – Sara Hoyle, Director, Human Services

# General Assistance

Meyer and Hoyle said the General Assistance (GA) operating budget is no longer as it was for staffing

costs and rent associated with the GA programs that are no longer operational. Some staff members in that program were reassigned to other areas while others were not.

Expenses are decreasing 74.17% and there are no revenues (see agenda packet). Hoyle reviewed the line item costs, including rent the County is required to pay for State Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) office staff, cremation and hospitalization costs. The hospitalization costs are budgeted because the County is still closing out accounts with CHI Health and Bryan hospitals. She added she does not anticipate budgeting for hospital costs for the 2022-2023 fiscal year. She also said the DHHS rent is an unfunded mandate.

Amundson exited the meeting at 10:52 a.m. and returned at 10:53 a.m.

# Human Services

Meyer reminded the Board the Human Services budget is split between the City and County.

A resolution on the upcoming Tuesday agenda will contain \$25,000 additional appropriations for the current year budget for Human Services.

Meyer stated expenses are increasing 10.03% and revenues are increasing 17.83% (see agenda packet). Hoyle added an employee from General Assistance was transferred to Human Services with those expenses being covered by a grant. IS costs are increasing for continued maintenance on the General Assistance database.

When asked about the rental assistance program, Hoyle said the first round of funding has been extended to March 2022. She stated there is a lot of flexibility in the use of the funds, which she is still waiting for guidance on from the federal government. A second round of funding will be made available for use through 2025. Currently, 16% of the received funds have been expended. Letters were sent to landowners with multiple properties that were outside of the City limits, which is where the majority of the applications for funds were received. There are two temporary employees paid for by the City who are assisting with entering applications in the databases. There are 900 applicants who need to submit documentation for their applications to be completed.

Concerning unfunded and underfunded mandates, Hoyle suggested watching the Community Aid funds that have many time-consuming administrative mandates associated with them.

# D. County Attorney – Pat Condon, County Attorney

Condon said no additional appropriations will be needed. A replacement for former Chief Deputy County Attorney Doug Cyr will be announced at a later date. Various other open attorney positions have not been filled yet. Those positions are in the budget and anticipated to be filled by late fall.

Meyer stated expenses are increasing 6.43% and revenues are increasing 8.02% (see agenda packet). Condon said the expenses include the new attorney position approved at the Mid-Year Budget meeting, and laboratory services. The laboratory expense has never been incurred and was added due to statutory requirements regarding rape kit testing. A request for a new attorney to assist with body worn cameras has also been added to the budget.

The technology fund request is for replacement equipment (see agenda packet).

Regarding future upgrades, the money in the sinking fund should cover the Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS) upgrade.

When asked about unfunded and underfunded mandates, Condon noted the requirement to review cases with individuals with Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits has the potential to put a strain on his employees.

Concerning the County Attorney Office's move to the 605 Building, Meyer said the furniture costs will be covered by the County's Building Fund.

Good morning! Please accept this as your Final Report for the 2021 session.

The true genesis of the old Chinese curse "May you live in interesting times" may be unknown, but it does clearly apply the 2021 session of the Nebraska Unicameral Legislature.

In the end, after a grueling 18-month process spanning two sessions, senators have adjourned sine die - returning to their districts to take a much-needed break from these 'interesting times'. In January, a tired and cranky legislature returned to the snow-capped capitol building. In front of them lay a rugged policy and political terrain of a new biennium, requiring passage of a state budget while balancing calls for tax reform and a wide array of spending initiatives - many of which had been waiting for a time when the Legislature had resources available. The heavy workload of the new biennium came on the heels of an extended 2020 session, which due to COVID was suspended from March until late July and August. When the body finally completed its work, there was little time before the engines of the 2021 session fired to life. Added to the mix were continued safety measures such as all-day committee hearings in January and February, social distancing, and limited access to the public and lobbyists. The mix of these precautions and long hours provided difficulty to many of the new senators in building relationships early in the session with their new colleagues. Instead, these new members arrived on the floor after committee hearings and had to navigate 49 different personalities and priorities. Tensions, sometimes boiling over into personal slights, pushed into every nook and cranny during the 84 days of the session. Through these tensions though, policy achievements were found, and the landscape of the upcoming 2022 session began to be formed.

One of the major accomplishments of the 2021 session was certainly the successful adoption of the biennial budget for Nebraska with no vetoes by Governor Ricketts. The budget contains \$9.7 billion in spending over 2 years, while maintaining around a 2.1% or less spending increase, as well as being balanced as is required by the state constitution. Major new spending included a 2% per year increase to provider rates across the board, as well as an additional cash infusion to the Property Tax Credit Fund. This fund to direct property tax relief over the two-year budget increased by \$63 million now devotes \$1.45 billion in that same period. In addition, the package increases the state's rainy-day fund, which is estimated to be over \$808 million by 2023.

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Too, taxpayers saw a victory when it comes to both personal and corporate income tax rates. Seniors relying upon social security income will start to see their tax liability to the state of Nebraska begin to come down next year to zero within in 10 years. Veterans tax liability will also come down as their pension benefits become less taxed by the state of Nebraska. Corporations will see a reduction in their rate to 7.25% in the next two years with intent language to bring it to 6.83% in the following biennium.

Some major initiatives were passed by the Legislature as well including a compromise to update training requirements for law enforcement; to provide for use of general funds and American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 for injection into the Nebraska economy for shovel-ready projects; modernization of Nebraska's Liquor Control Act with allowance for "to go" and "drive through" purchase of alcoholic beverages as well as providing for a definition of and tax rate similar to states around Nebraska for canned cocktails; an appropriation of \$20 Million per year for the next four years for the deployment of broadband to unserved and underserved areas of the state; a statutory construct to implement casino gaming at horse tracks throughout Nebraska; a bill that will rival Wyoming in attracting cryptocurrency institutions to the state; adoption of crisis standards of care for health care institutions across the state while providing for safe harbor for those businesses who acted in conformity with CDC guidelines during the pandemic; finally, a commitment to provide funding to the University of Nebraska system for maintenance of their facilities for over 40 years.

Even with this level of property and income tax relief, many senators argue that enough has not been done, and promising 2022 will see proposals for major overhauls to the entirety of Nebraska's tax system. Taking center stage will be reduction in property taxes through expected plans that amend school financing, sales tax exemptions, existing tax rates, and state spending. Following the failure of a consumption tax measure in the body in 2021 a petition drive to place measure before voters on the 2022 ballot is also expected. This measure as previously proposed would impose a 10.64% on all consumption of goods and services, while eliminating income, sales, inheritance, and property taxes.

Senators are expected to return in September for a special session focusing strictly on redistricting of the legislature's districts, as well as Nebraska's three congressional districts prior to the 2022 elections. The 2022 races will see a new governor, as well as 12 open seats in the legislature. Additionally, another 12 members will be eligible to seek a second term. It is expected that the third congressional district, comprising, geographically, most of the state's area, will lose several seats during this process due to continued population loss. This shift has already created a tense situation, seen during the hearing on the redistricting committee's hearing on the process they will follow when agricultural and rural interest groups opposed the procedure arguing that it will negatively impact their power within the body.

Like all sessions, the 2021 Nebraska Legislature took steps forward. Unlike those that came before however, the members of this legislature will have a place in history not because of what they passed necessarily, but instead because of the circumstances that they had to operate. Those who have been part of it will forever remember the total upheaval in the traditional way the legislature operates, with hopes that it will never have to be that way again. Now, views point towards a long quiet, where senators will spend time with their families, friends, and jobs in their districts before their gaze moves to 2022. With Speaker Hilgers' call for members to rest in order "to take big swings in 2022", the question is now is how these interesting times will amend the normal times of the future.

### LANCASTER COUNTY PRIORITIES

<u>Defeat Inheritance Tax Repeal.</u> Three bills have been introduced which would repeal or amend the inheritance tax:

LB133 (Erdman) Adopt the Nebraska EPIC Consumption Tax Act and eliminate certain other taxes. OPPOSE. *The bill remains held in committee.* 

LR11CA (Erdman) Constitutional amendment to require enactment of a consumption tax and prohibit certain other forms of taxation. OPPOSE. Senator Erdman declared LR11CA to be his priority for this session. The Revenue Committee did advance LR11CA. The resolution was debated for approximately 6 hours on Wednesday, May 5, 2021. The bill failed to advance to Select File. Those members of the delegation and how they voted are noted here: YES (Against our position): Geist, Hilgers. NO/NOT VOTING (With our Position): Bostar, M. Hansen, Pansing-Brooks, Wishart, Brandt, Dorn, Morfeld. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

**LB310 (Clements) Change inheritance tax rates and exemption amount. OPPOSE** The bill would fundamentally change the amounts collected under the inheritance tax and almost phase it out. We have already touched base with NACO and with Douglas County regarding work on this issue this interim. We think it very important to begin to collect data on the potential impact to counties over the interim. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

<u>Defeat Legislation Limiting Growth.</u> One constitutional amendment and one legislative bill were introduced this year that deal with this. Only LB408 has emerged from committee:

**LB408 (Briese)** Adopt the Property Tax Request Act. This bill would adopt the Property Tax Request Act. Definitions are included for approved bonds, political subdivision, property tax request, and real growth value. A political subdivision's property tax request for any year would not exceed its property tax request in the prior year by more than 3%, except as otherwise provided in this section. A political subdivision would be able to exceed the limit provided in this section by an amount approved by a majority of registered voters voting on the issue in a primary, general, or special election at which the issue is placed before the registered voters. The limit in this section would not apply to that portion of a political subdivision's property tax request that is needed to pay the principal and interest on approved bonds and that will be derived from the real growth value for the political subdivision.

The debate occurred Thursday, April 22, 2021 and after 8 hours of debate, the bill failed on a cloture motion. Those members of the delegation and how they voted are noted here: YES (Against our position) Brandt, Dorn, Geist, Hilgers. NO/NOT VOTING (With our Position) Bostar, Matt Hansen, Morfeld, Pansing-Brooks, Wishart. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

### Statewide 24/7 Sobriety.

**LB271 (Morfeld) Adopt the 24**/7 **Sobriety Program Act**. **SUPPORT**. On Wednesday, May 19, 2021, the Legislature passed LB271 on a vote of 36-11-2. The entire delegation voted to pass the bill. On Tuesday, May 25, 2021 we received word from Senator Morfeld that the Governor had signed the bill

### Sharing of Mental Health Information.

LB663 (Geist) Require the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice to create a mental health indicator in a criminal justice information system to alert emergency dispatch operators. This legislation is our version of sharing of mental health information. Senator Geist made some changes to the draft in the last hours before introduction that limited the scope of the bill. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

### Infrastructure Funding.

**LB242 (Brandt) Provide for county bridges under the Political Subdivisions Construction Alternatives Act. SUPPORT.** This bill would allow for a longer payment period and for design-build for bridges. As noted in reports throughout the session, we sent over a re-worked version of the amendment that incorporated some of the language from LB414 this year. Senator Brandt indicated that he wanted this bill to be held over for the 2022 session. The bill is currently 14<sup>th</sup> in worksheet order to come up next session. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

### Gaming Revenue.

LB73 (Geist) Direct a portion of the proceeds from the Nebraska Racetrack Gaming Act to county agricultural societies. SUPPORT. For the Nebraska Racetrack Gaming Act, 25% of the tax is already remitted to the county treasurer of the county in which the licensed racetrack enclosure is located. 10% of the distribution remitted would be distributed to the county agricultural society in the county in which the licensed racetrack enclosure is located if such county agricultural society has been formed in the county under the County Agricultural Society Act. Following any distribution to a county agricultural society, the remaining funds would be distributed by the county treasurer. The General Affairs Committee advanced LB73 on Tuesday, April 13, 2021 on a vote of 6 to 2 (Yes: Wayne, Lowe, Briese, Brewer, Brandt, Arch No: J. Cavanaugh, Groene). The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

### **BILLS IDENTIFIED BY COMMISSIONERS/DEPARTMENT HEADS**

**Commissioner Flowerday – LB444 (Hansen, M.) Change provisions relating to credit against jail terms.** *If a person is arrested on one charge and prosecuted on another charge growing out of conduct which occurred prior to such person's arrest, credit against the term of any sentence resulting from such prosecution would be given for all time spent in custody under the former charge which has not been credited* 

against another sentence. The bill has been advanced by the Judiciary Committee and placed on General File on a 7-0-1 vote. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

**David Derbin** – LB83 (Flood) Change the Open Meetings Act to provide for virtual conferencing. The bill passed on a vote of 43-0 on Thursday, April 15, 2021 and was signed by the Governor. The bill is now in effect.

**Brad Johnson - LB111 (Albrecht) Change provisions relating to various offenses involving public safety. SUPPORT.** *Relating to public safety crimes and offenses, criminal mischief or unauthorized application of graffiti would be a Class IV felony if the property involved in the offense belongs to a peace officer, active-duty member in the armed services of the US, judge, or elected or appointed government official and the offense was committed with the intent to harass or intimidate such person because of such person's status. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.* 

**Cori R. Beattie - LB291 (Friesen) Change provisions relating to property tax protests.** Relating to property tax protests, each protest would be made on a form prescribed by the Tax Commissioner, signed, and filed with the county clerk of the county where the property is assessed. The protest would contain or have attached a statement of the reason or reasons why the requested change should be made, including the requested valuation. The board discussed this bill at the staff meeting on April 8, 2021. At the meeting on April 15, 2021, Dan Nolte informed the board that Douglas and Sarpy County Clerks were meeting with Senator Friesen. On Tuesday, the bill was debated, and Senator Friesen offered an amendment that was the fruit of those discussions that would allow a county to use their own system if it captured the same information as the state form. The bill was amended and advanced to Select File.

On Tuesday, April 27, 2021, the bill was debated again on Select File and Senator Steve Erdman pushed back on the bill. The bill passed Final Reading on May 19, 2019 and was signed by the Governor on May 21, 2021.

**Cori R. Beattie - LB557 (M. Hansen) Change provisions relating to public records and include body-worn camera recordings in certain circumstances.** *This bill contains multiple provisions including what is noted in the one liner that would require recordings on body cameras to be open records and required to provide them to the media. The bill also bifurcates a request made by a Nebraska resident for public records to allow for up to 8 hours of research to be done on the same; but it also makes it possible to bill non-resident requesters for a percentage of the researcher's salary. The hearing on this bill was held on February 25, 2021. The bill was advanced by the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee on an 8-0 vote that would eliminates all provisions of the bill as introduced except the material relating to recordings from body-worn cameras that "depict or record circumstances in which a person died while being apprehended by" law enforcement or "while in the custody of" law enforcement or detention personnel. With AM 1021, these records would be subject to disclosure upon request, but only after the conclusion of related grand jury proceedings. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.* 

Pam Dingman - LB339 (Bostelman) Require a utility coordination plan for certain highway and bridge contracts. Introduced by Senator Bostelman at the

request of the Associated General Contractors, the bill would require any contract exceeding \$50,000 for the construction, reconstruction, improvement, maintenance, or repair of a road, street, highway, bridge, or other related structure to which the Department of Transportation or any city of the metropolitan class, any city of the primary or first class, or any county with more than 25,000 inhabitants is a party would require a utility coordination plan. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

**David Derbin - LB657 (Vargas) Require the office of Legislative Research to prepare racial impact statements for legislative bills. SUPPORT**. Beginning in the second session of the 107th Legislature, the office of Legislative Research would prepare and provide racial impact statements for designated bills or resolutions as determined by the Executive Board of the Legislative Council. A racial impact statement would clearly summarize the estimated impact of a bill on racial populations in the state and the estimated impact of the bill on racial disparities in the state. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

### **BILLS OF NOTE**

**LB201 (Pansing-Brooks) Change provisions relating to jurisdiction over juveniles.** *Douglas County Support. Relating to juveniles, the accused would be able to be arraigned in county court or district court if the alleged offense is a traffic offense and the accused was 11 years of age or older at the time the alleged traffic offense was committed, or if the accused were 16 or 17 years of age when an alleged offense was committed, following a transfer from juvenile court. The juvenile court would have exclusive original jurisdiction as to any juvenile who was under 18 years (no longer 16) of age at the time the alleged offense was committed under this subdivision would be able to be transferred to county court or district court if the juvenile was 14, 15, 16, or 17 years of age at the time the alleged offense was held on January 28<sup>th</sup>, 2021 by the Judiciary Committee. Proponent testimony was presented by the Juvenile Division of the Lancaster County Public Defender's Office and the Administrator of Juvenile Reform Efforts. In opposition was the Nebraska County Attorneys Association. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.* 

LB419 (Cavanaugh, J.) Require appointment of counsel in eviction proceedings and provide for a filing fee. NEUTRAL. Douglas County Bill of Concern. This bill was heard in the Judiciary Committee on February 4<sup>th</sup>. Proponents of the bill came from various housing advocacy groups throughout the state. Opposition to the bill came from property owners and landlords. Our neutral testimony was dropped for the hearing. The only question that came up regarding our fiscal note was about Douglas County being able to do the program for \$1 Million and Lancaster at \$2 Million. The bill remains held in committee. The bill remains alive for reprioritization and debate in 2022.

### LB414 (Wishart) Change provisions of the Political Subdivisions

**Construction Alternatives Act.** The hearing on this bill was right before our LB242. The bill was advanced by the Government, Military & Veterans Affairs Committee. The bill was added to Tuesday, April 6<sup>th</sup>'s consent calendar and the bill advanced to Select File. The bill was debated on April 12, 2021 and advanced to Final Reading. The bill passed on Final Reading on April 20, 2021 on a vote of 47-0-2 and was approved by the Governor on April 23, 2021.

LB525 (Wishart) Provide duties and requirements for transitional housing facilities and change powers of the Office of Inspector General of the Nebraska Correctional System. MONITOR. The bill was advanced to General File by the Judiciary Committee with AM602 which was attached for your review to our report on April 1, 2021. This bill will be held over for the 2022 session.

**LB644 (Hansen, B) Adopt the Property Tax Request Act. OPPOSE.** We worked actively with NACO, the League of Nebraska Municipalities, the Nebraska Association of School Boards, and the Community Colleges. The amendment that all these parties agreed to was adopted on April 28, 2021 and advanced to Final Reading. The bill passed on Final Reading on May 19, 2021 and signed by the Governor on May 24, 2021.

**LB2 (Briese) Change the valuation of agricultural land and horticultural land for certain school district taxes. OPPOSE.** The bill was advanced by the Revenue Committee with an amendment that raises the percentage from 30% to 50% and incorporates the provisions of LB79 which would change the minimum amount of relief provided under the Property Tax Credit Act at the base amount plus 3% each year. The bill was debated on Tuesday, April 20 and Wednesday, April 21 with Senators raising a significant number of concerns on the bill on General File. The bill advanced to Select File on a vote of 38-4. On April 28, 2021, the Legislature took the bill up on Select File and advanced it to Final Reading. The bill passed on Final Reading on May 19, 2021 and signed by the Governor on May 24, 2021.

LB165 (Erdman) Change provisions relating to the assessment of real **property that suffers significant property damage. OPPOSE.** *Relating to* property taxes, damaged real property would replace the term destroyed real property. Any events causing significant property damage that occurs with enough frequency in this state would be made to grant property tax relief to owners of real property adversely affected by such events. Significant property damage would no longer include damage exceeding 20% of the property's assessed value in the current tax year as determined by the county assessor. The county assessor would also inspect and review all properties for which a report has been filed under this section and would submit a comprehensive report of all such properties to the county board of equalization on or before July 20 of the current assessment year. The bill remains held in committee. However, Senator Erdman did attempt to attach the provisions of this bill to LB595. We worked in cooperation with NACO to defeat the amendment. How our delegation voted: AGAINST/NOT VOTING ON AM1140 (with county position): Bostar, Geist, M. Hansen, Morfeld, Pansing-Brooks, Wishart. SUPPORT AM1140 (against county position): Brandt, Dorn, Hilgers. On May 7, 2021, Senator Erdman received an Attorney General's opinion on LB165. The opinion concludes that the bill does not plainly violate the uniformity clause. This bill will be held over for the 2022 session. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

LB189 (Halloran) Change provisions relating to property tax refunds. MONITOR. Douglas County Bill of Concern. The bill was advanced by the Revenue Committee to General File. During consideration of LB644, the provisions of this bill were amended into that bill. As noted, LB644 was passed on Final Reading on May 19, 2021 and signed by the Governor on May 24, 2021.

LB335 (Flood) Require announcement of the average cost of incarceration at sentencing for sentences served at the Department of Correctional Services. MONITOR. Beginning 9/15/2022, when sentencing a defendant to any term of imprisonment in an institution of the department, the court would announce in open court and on the record the total estimated cost to the taxpayers of such term of imprisonment. On or before 8/1/2022, and on or before each August 1 thereafter the Department would calculate the average cost of imprisonment for inmates in Department institutions for the preceding year and report such amount or amounts to the commission in a form and manner prescribed by the commission. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

LB313 (Sanders) Change provisions relating to late applications for homestead exemptions. SUPPORT. *Douglas County & Sarpy County* 

**Support.** The bill was advanced to General File by the Revenue Committee with a proposed amendment, AM367, that I attached with previous reports. The bill was placed on consent calendar and discussed on Monday, May 3, 2021. The bill was advanced to Select File with AM367 attached and on Monday, May 10, 2021, the bill advanced to Final Reading. The bill passed on Final Reading on May 19, 2021 and signed by the Governor on May 24, 2021..

**LR3CA (Slama) Constitutional amendment to require verification of identity prior to voting. OPPOSE.** This constitutional amendment would require verification of identity prior to voting to combat voter fraud, preserve the relative power of each eligible citizen's right to vote, modernize the election infrastructure of the state, and ensure the integrity of the elections of the state to preserve the public confidence in the legitimacy of the elected government. A poll worker would review a photograph or digital image of each voter to verify the identity of the voter in a manner determined by the Legislature prior to allowing the voter to vote. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

**LB613 (Erdman) Change provisions relating to hearings and decisions on appeals under the Tax Equalization and Review Commission Act. OPPOSE. Douglas County Bill of High Concern**. This bill adds a 'speedy hearing right' to TERC appeals; if no decision by TERC has been reached within nine months after the filing date of the appeal, the appeal shall be decided in favor of the property owner. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

**LB622 (Friesen) Limit the growth of real property valuations and provide for adjustments to assessed values.** *Douglas County Bill of High Concern. This bill will create an annual limit on real property value increases at 3% over the previous year for both "agricultural and horticulture" and "non-agricultural" and calls for action by the Tax Commissioner to reduce if the increase exceeds 3%. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.* 

**LB179 (Linehan) Transition from elected to appointed county assessors**. **OPPOSE.** Starting on 1/1/2023, the county board of every county which has an elected county assessor would appoint a county assessor or designate the county clerk to serve as county assessor. Each county having a population of more than 3,500 inhabitants and having more than 1,200 tax returns in any tax year would have a county assessor appointed by the county board and each other county would have a county assessor or would have the county clerk serve as county assessor as determined by the county board. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

# LB103 (Dorn) Appropriate funds to aid counties to pay certain federal

**judgments. MONITOR**. This bill would appropriate funds to aid counties to pay for federal judgments. It would appropriate \$2 million from the General Fund for FY 2021-22 and FY 2022-23 to any county that has a judgment in excess of \$25 million rendered against it by a federal court for a violation of federal law if the total cost of the judgment is equal to 20% or more of the county's annual budget. The bill was signed by the Governor on May 25, 2021. The Governor sent a rare letter indicating that he did not like the idea of this kind of assistance to a county but because it was a single time event he would sign it, reluctantly.

LB178 (Lindstrom) Adopt the Infrastructure Improvement and Replacement Assistance Act and provide for a turnback of state sales tax revenue. Sarpy Bill of Interest. Introduced at the request of the League of Nebraska Municipalities. This bill would adopt the Infrastructure Improvement and Replacement Assistance Act and provide for a turnback of state sales tax revenue. The state would assist political subdivisions and sewer and water utilities by turning back a percentage of certain state sales tax revenue to political subdivisions and sewer and water utilities. For sales tax imposed from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2022, 36.36%. For sales tax imposed from 7/1/2022 through 6/30/2024, 54.54%. For sales tax imposed after 7/1/2024, 72.72%. Funds received would be used exclusively to assist in paying for infrastructure improvements, paying for redevelopment and replacement of obsolete water or sewer facilities, or repaying bonds issued and pledged for such work. Another purpose would be to use the funds to defer increases in sewer and water rates. The bill was advanced by the Revenue Committee and reported to General File on March 2, 2021. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

LR25 (Health and Human Services Committee) Provide the Legislative Council appoint a special committee of the Legislature to be known as the Youth Rehabilitation and Treatment Center Special Oversight Committee of the Legislature. MONITOR. This resolution would provide that the Legislative Council appoint a special committee of the Legislature to be known as the Youth Rehabilitation and Treatment Center Special Oversight Committee of the Legislature. The resolution was advanced by the Executive Board to the Legislature for further consideration. On Tuesday, March 23, 2021, the Legislature passed the resolution without amendment on a vote of 32-0.

**LB424 (Brewer) Provide and change zoning requirements for wind energy generation projects. OPPOSE.** Beginning 9/1/2021, no wind energy generation project would be constructed unless the county in which the project would be located has zoning regulations or a zoning resolution meeting the requirements of this section. The zoning provisions would address fixed-distance setbacks, noise standards, any noise-measuring instruments, decommissioning terms and conditions, and fees for conditional use permits for wind energy generation projects. The procedure used to measure noise would meet the requirements of the American National Standards Institute, the International Electrotechnical Commission, or the International

Organization for Standardization for the measurement of sound. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

# LB577 (Bostar) Establish Election Day as a holiday and change provisions relating to early voting and automatic voter registration. NEUTRAL.

Election Day, the first Tuesday following the first Monday in November in each evennumbered year, would be a holiday. If a voter registration application is submitted under this section with the signature of the applicant but the applicant is not eligible to register to vote, the submission would not be considered a violation of section 32-1502 or 32-1503 and the document submitted would not be considered a valid or completed voter registration application for purposes of registration or enforcement of the Election Act unless the applicant has willfully and knowingly taken affirmative steps to register to vote knowing that he or she is not eligible to do so. An applicant would be given the opportunity to choose not to use his or her information for voter registration, otherwise the applicant would complete the voter registration portion that is transmitted to the election commissioner or county clerk to register the applicant to vote or update his or her voter registration record. The bill remains alive for reprioritization and debate in 2022.

**LB329 (Wayne) Change provisions relating to taxes imposed on the average wholesale price of gasoline. SUPPORT.** Introduced at the request of the League of Nebraska Municipalities. The minimum average wholesale price of gasoline to be used to calculate the tax in this section for tax periods, beginning on and after 7/1/2021, would be \$2.44. In no case would the average wholesale price of gasoline be less than the minimum amount required under this subsection. The Department would use at least 35% of the amount allocated to the Highway Cash Fund to pay for surface transportation projects, as defined in section 29-2702 (money received; disposition), of the highest priority as determined by the Department. The bill remains alive for reprioritization and debate in 2022.

LB636 (Cavanaugh, J) Eliminate cash bail bonds, appearance bonds, and related provisions. Relating to criminal procedure, cash bail bonds, appearance bonds, and all related provisions would be eliminated. A judge would be able to release a defendant on personal recognizance. In determining this, the judge would be able to take into account, among other things, the nature and circumstances of the offense, yet to be collected evidence, alleged victims, potential witnesses, or members of the general public, the defendant's family ties, employment, the length of the defendant's residence in the community, the defendant's record of criminal convictions, and the defendant's record of appearances at court proceedings or of flight to avoid prosecution or of failure to appear at court proceedings. Other considerations for releasing someone on personal recognizance are listed in detail. The approval or denial process is also described. The bill remains alive for re-prioritization and debate in 2022.

LB236 (Brewer) Permit counties to authorize carrying concealed weapons as prescribed. Counties would have the power to authorize the permit-less carrying of concealed weapons for all persons not otherwise prohibited from possessing or carrying such weapons under state or federal law. On Friday, May 7, 2021, Senator Brewer received an opinion from Attorney General Doug Peterson that I have attached. The opinion concluded that the bill was unconstitutional. As such, Senator Tom Brewer has filed an amendment, AM1388 that would strike all provisions of the bill and insert the provisions of the following bills that are summarized - LB85, LB244, LB173 (as amended). LB85 would require Nebraska State Patrol to provide notice of expiration of concealed handgun permits. At least 4 months before expiration of a permit to carry a concealed handgun, the Nebraska State Patrol would send to the permit holder by US mail or electronically notice of expiration of the permit. LB244 states that the renewal would be able to be applied for no earlier than 4 months before expiration of the permit and no later than 30 business days after the date of expiration of the concealed carry permit. LB173 is a bill relating to firearms, the offense of carrying a concealed weapon would not apply to possessing, carrying, transporting, shipping, or receiving a firearm for any lawful purpose to or from any place where such firearm may be lawfully possessed or carried by a person if such firearm is unloaded and stored in a case and such person is not otherwise prohibited by state or federal law from possessing, carruing, transporting, shipping, or receiving a firearm. Senator Ben Hansen offered, and the Legislature adopted an amendment that updated Nebraska's schedule of controlled substances. The bill was moved to Final Reading on May 18, 2021. The bill passed on Final Reading on May 21, 2021 and signed by the *Governor on May 26, 2021.* 

### **BUDGET ITEMS OF NOTE**

**LB462 (Dorn) Appropriate funds to the Department of Health and Human Services. SUPPORT. Douglas County Support.** This bill would provide a rate increase for behavioral health services of 3% for FY 2021-22 and 3% for FY 2022-23 to Agency No. 25, Department of Health and Human Services, Program 348, Medical Assistance, and Program 349, Medicaid Expansion. The provisions of this bill and the requested amount were not included the mainline budget. However, all providers are receiving a 2% increase which equals an \$83.5 Million increase over the next two years. This amount remains intact in the budget. The budget was sent to the Governor on Tuesday, April 19, 2021. The Governor returned the budget with no line-item reductions so this funding will go into effect on July 1, 2021.

LB585 (Vargas) Appropriate funds for local public health departments. Appropriate funds for local public health departments. SUPPORT Douglas County Support. There would be appropriated \$5 million from the General Fund to Agency No. 25, Program No. 502, for FY 2021-22. Such funds would be provided for local public health departments. Included in the appropriation in this section would be \$75,000 for critical health services aid to be allocated to each of the 18 public health departments and \$3.65 million for proportional health services aid to be distributed proportionally based on population among the 18 public health departments.

The provisions of this bill and the requested amount were included the mainline budget in the following amounts - \$1.5 Million in FY2021-22 and \$1.5 Million in FY2022-23 with an additional \$1.5 Million to be distributed based on population. This amount remains intact in the budget. Senator Groene did attempt to remove this increase on Select File but he was not successful. The budget was sent to the Governor on Tuesday, April 19, 2021. The Governor returned the budget with no line-item reductions so this funding will go into effect on July 1, 2021.

**LB192 (Wishart) State intent regarding appropriations for law enforcement training and certification. SUPPORT.** This bill would state that the intent of the Legislature to appropriate \$140,000 from the General Fund to the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for each of FY 2021-22 and

2022-23 for in-person and online training for law enforcement officer to be certified through an accreditation agency approved by the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice. The provisions of this bill and the requested amount were included the mainline budget. This amount remains intact in the budget. The budget was sent to the Governor on Tuesday, April 19, 2021. The Governor returned the budget with no line-item reductions so this funding will go into effect on July 1, 2021.

LB193 (Wishart) State intent regarding appropriations for law enforcement training. SUPPORT. This bill would state that the intent of the Legislature to appropriate \$800,000 from the General Fund to the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for FY 2021-22 for the purchase of 2 law enforcement training systems and software to simulate real life encounters of law enforcement officers. It would also be their intent that the systems and software be designed for law enforcement officers to train on the use of nondeadly force and that the Nebraska Police Standards Advisory Council direct the location of such systems so that they are not located where similar systems are in place for law enforcement officers. The provisions of this bill and the requested amount were not included the mainline budget.

**LB304 (Hansen, M) Appropriate funds to the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice. SUPPORT.** This bill would appropriate \$172,000 from the General Fund for FY 2021-22 to the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice to be used by the Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center to enforce sections 81-1456 (employment of law enforcement officer; submit personnel change in status form; record; contents; report of termination or resignation in lieu of termination) and 81-1457 (employment of law enforcement officer; waiver to prospective employer; contents; form; former employer; duties) relating to revocation of law enforcement officer certification.

The provisions of this bill and the requested amount were included the mainline budget and split into each year of the biennium. This amount remains intact in the budget. The budget was sent to the Governor on Tuesday, April 19, 2021. The Governor returned the budget with no line-item reductions so this funding will go into effect on July 1, 2021.

This concludes our report. We appreciated the opportunity to represent you this year and hope we will continue to do so that, together, we can "swing for the fences" in 2022!



This bill would adopt the 24/7 Sobriety Program Act. Each county, through its county sheriff, would be able to participate in a 24/7 sobriety program. If a sheriff is unwilling or unable to participate in a 24/7 sobriety program would program, the sheriff would be able to designate an entity willing to provide the service. This program would meet at least the following minimum requirements: (a) testing would occur either twice a day or every day at a testing location or locations established by the county sheriff or a designated entity or continuously with a continuous alcohol monitoring device or similar technology, (b) participants would not consume alcohol or any drug not prescribed by a physician. Sanctions for violations of the program would be according to best practices. If a person is enrolled in a 24/7 sobriety program under this Act and has not violated any program conditions for drugs or alcohol after 30 consecutive days of testing, such person would be able to apply for a 24/7 sobriety program permit as a condition of bail under the 24/7 Sobriety Program Act. Such permit would expire at the same time as the later of any administrative license revocation being served.

AM490 would add new language to Sections 5, 8, and 11. Section 5 would be amended to clarify that a 24/7 sobriety program permit could only be issued if the person'sbeen revoked pursuant to an administrative license revocation and the person is not otherwise ineligible; Section 8 would be amended to clarify that the state pretrial diversion plan for minor traffic violations does not apply to DUI offenses. This section would also be amended to provide that DUI offenses are dismissed twelve months after completion of pretrial diversion; Section 11 would be amended to clarify that only a person subject to administrative license revocation may apply for a 24/7 sobriety program permit.

AM1002 adopted on Select File clarified that being in a 24/7 program shall be ordered by court; that a court has the opportunity to use any technology to detect the use or presence of alcohol or methods of supervision; finally, the amendment ensures that the level of penalty mirrors violation of an interlock.

2021 Standing

As introduced on January 12, this bill authorizes counties to create 24/7 sobriety programs for DUI offenders in place of incarceration. During the hearing on February 17, the Lancaster County Public Defender's Office and National County Attorney's Association supported this new measure of accountability, while the Department of Motor Vehicles and Director of the Coalition of Ignition Interlock Manufacturers opposed its costs. Subsequently, the Judiciary Committee advanced it to General File with AM490. This language clarifies the bill's scope and consequences, limiting it to administrative license revocations and stating that DUI offenses are dismissed twelve months after pretrial diversion. Once the body adopted AM490 and Senator Morefeld's amendments on BAC testing and funding, the Legislature placed it on Final Reading April 29 where it was passed on a vote of 36-11-2 on May 19th, and was approved by the Governor on May 24th.

Adopt the Uniform Foreign-Country Money Judgments Recognition Act, the Uniform Registration of Canadian Money Judgments Act, the Uniform Powers of Appointment Act, and the Uniform Easement Relocation Act and change provisions relating to succession to real property and claims against the estate of a medical assistance recipient

By itself, LB501 removes the need to obtain consent from an easement holder when relocating a unilateral easement. Because this change does not apply to public utilities or conservation easements, the Judiciary Committee advanced it unanimously on March 10. However, when they did so, they added a white copy amendment that combines LB501 with four additional bills, which do one of three things:

LB403 and LB 470 specify when one can re-direct estate funds, such as when DHHS can recoup Medicaid payments from a deceased estate owner or when a third party has the authority to revise said agreements

LB 348 makes the affidavit process more user-friendly, stating that only one successor signature is needed for small estate situations. To attract more capital, LB 593 creates two Acts that establish a procedure for money judgments coming to and from the U.S.

After introducers filed two more clerical revisions to this package, the Legislature incorporated these provisions into LB501 on April 1, and the omnibus bill passed its Final Reading on April 29 with a 47-0-2 vote. The Governor later approved it on May 5.

By itself, LB561 changes the membership of the Racing Commission for the said merger, and it held considerable support from both commissioners and market advisors during the General Affairs Committee on February 1. That's when the Committee merged it with LB560 upon advancing it, classifying it as AM426 therein.

Ranked-choice voting means an election voting system in which a voter uses a ranked ballot to indicate the voter's preference between candidates and the results are determined using the ranked-choice voting count. The Secretary of State would provide for the proper and efficient administration of elections determined by ranked-choice voting. This method would be different from the traditional "fill-in-the-one-oval" method, as each candidate would have to be ranked. The specific process is described.

This bill would adopt the Nebraska EPIC Consumption Tax Act and eliminate certain other taxes. EPIC stands for the elimination of property (imposed pursuant to Chapter 77), income (state income and state sales and use tax imposed pursuant to the Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967), and corporate taxes. The inheritance tax imposed pursuant to sections 77-2001 to 77-2040 would also be repealed. This would become effective 12/31/2024. The Nebraska Taxpayer's Bill of Rights would also be established, stating that citizens of Nebraska are entitled to a fair and just tax system. Beginning on 1/1/2024, there would be a tax imposed on the use or consumption in the State of Nebraska of taxable property or services. The rate would be 10.64%. Land, purchase of fuel, taxable property or service purchased for a business purpose in a trade or business, investment purpose, educational purpose, and used property among other listed items would not be subject to the consumption tax.

The formula for consumption tax monthly allowance is provided as the product of the consumption tax rate and the monthly poverty level for a family of the size of the qualified family. The process related to qualified families is provided in detail. The Consumption Tax Transition Fund would be created in order to pay the consumption tax monthly allowance to the heads of households of qualified families. It would be a destination principle tax. The process related to registered sellers is provided in detail. There would be a penalty of \$500 for anyone who is required to register under this but fails to do so. This would not limit the ability of counties, cities, or villages from imposing a separate consumption tax within their limits. Beginning 1/1/2024, the primary source of funding for all public and elementary schools and for all educational service units would be the taxes collected under this Act.

The State Treasurer would transfer \$240 million from the Cash Reserve Fund to the Consumption Tax Transition Fund on or before 12/31/2023. The Community College Aid Act would apply until 1/1/2024. After this, community colleges would be funded as provided under this Act.

CHAMBER SUMMARY: "LB133 eliminates all state income, sales and use taxes, property taxes and inheritance taxes. Refer to LR 11 CA for the related Constitutional Amendment. Beginning January 1, 2024, there is hereby imposed a tax on the use or consumption in the State of Nebraska of taxable property or services. The rate of the consumption tax shall be ten and sixty-four hundredths percent (10.64%). The person purchasing taxable property or services in the State of Nebraska shall be liable for the tax. The bill creates numerous exemptions for purchases such as fuel, used property, property or service purchased for a business purpose in a trade or business, property or service used for educational purposes, etc.

Funding for schools would be through a collective request through the Department of Education. Funding for other political subdivision would go through the local county. All local political subdivisions would have to work with the county within their jurisdiction to have the county submit a total budget request to the Legislature."

This bill would adopt the COVID-19 Liability Protection Act. Definitions are provided for COVID-19, COVID-19 state of emergency, first responder, gross negligence, health care facility, health care provider, health care service, minimum medical condition, person, premises, public health guidance, and willful misconduct. A person would not be able to bring or maintain a civil action seeking recovery for any injuries or damages sustained from exposure or potential exposure to COVID-19 unless the plaintiff can prove, by clear and convincing evidence, that the civil action relates to a minimum medical condition resulting from gross negligence or willful misconduct.

A person would also not be able to bring or maintain a civil action (even against health care providers/facilities or first responders unless proven beyond clear and convincing evidence) seeking recovery for any injuries or damages sustained from exposure or potential exposure to COVID-19 if the act or omission alleged to violate a duty of care was permitted by, in substantial compliance with, or consistent with any federal or state statute, regulation, or order or public health guidance related to COVID-19. A person who owns, occupies, possesses, or is in control of a premises, including a tenant, lessee, or occupant of a premises would not be liable in any civil action seeking recovery for any injuries or damages sustained from exposure or potential exposure to COVID-19, unless the plaintiff can prove, by clear and convincing evidence, that the civil action relates to a minimum medical condition resulting from gross negligence or willful misconduct. Any civil action related to COVID-19 exposure would have to be brought within 2 years after the cause of action would have accrued. This would apply to any cause of action accruing on or after the effective date of this act and before the earlier of either 12/31/2022 or 1 year after the end of the COVID-19 state of emergency.

Committee amendment AM 1293 is a white copy amendment that includes an amended version of LB 139 and LB 53. The amendment provides new definitions for "Covid-19", "Federal public health guidance" and "person" that includes various types of business organizations, the State and political subdivisions, and schools and universities. Person also includes officers and employees as well as agents and volunteers of the covered organizations. The amendment prohibits civil actions after the effective date if the alleged act or omission was in substantial compliance with federal health guidance. The amendment maintains the provisions in section 7 of the original proposal that provide that the Act does not create or recognize a cause of action, affect worker's compensation actions, change common law immunities or limitations of liability, or constitute a waiver of sovereign immunity. AM 1293 also includes an amended version of LB 53 that establishes the Health Care Crisis Protocol Act. The committee amendment requires the Department of Health and Human Services to establish a health care crisis protocol containing listed criteria. The amendment also creates an advisory committee under the Department of Health and Human Services to advise and make recommendations on the protocol.

During General File consideration, AM1375 was offered by Senator Lathrop that re-wrote sections 5 to 9 and renamed the act as the Health Care Crisis Protocol Act and cited to the protocol that was prepared by the Nebraska Medical Emergency Operations Center dated May 10, 2021.

Counties would have the power to authorize the carrying of concealed weapons for all persons not otherwise prohibited from possessing or carrying such weapons under state or federal law.

The committee amendment would require that counties consult with their sheriff before passing the sort of ordinance contemplated by LB 236. It would also require persons engaged in the lawful permitless carrying of a concealed weapon to immediately inform any emergency responder in the event of an official contact. Finally, the amendment limits the power to pass a permitless carry ordinance to those counties that do not contain a city of the metropolitan or primary class. Senator Brewer filed AM874 that would revise the limitation on which counties could enact an ordinance to only those counties with less than 100,000 people.

On May 10, 2021, the Attorney General issued an opinion indicating that LB236 is unconstitutional. As such, Senator Tom Brewer has filed an amendment, AM1388 that would strike all provisions of the bill and insert the provisions of the following bills that are summarized - LB85, LB244, LB173 (as amended). LB85 would require Nebraska State Patrol to provide notice of expiration of concealed handgun permits. At least 4 months before expiration of a permit to carry a concealed handgun, the Nebraska State Patrol would send to the permit holder by US mail or electronically notice of expiration of the permit. LB244 states that the renewal would be able to be applied for no earlier than 4 months before expiration of the permit and no later than 30 business days after the date of expiration of the concealed carry permit. LB173 is a bill relating to firearms, the offense of carrying a concealed weapon would not apply to possessing, carrying, transporting, shipping, or receiving a firearm for any lawful purpose to or from any place where such firearm may be lawfully possessed or carried by a person if such firearm is unloaded and stored in a case and such person is not otherwise prohibited by state or federal law from possessing, carrying, transporting, shipping, or receiving a firearm.



As we discussed, I am requesting a cost-sharing arrangement with Lancaster County to improve a portion of Wittstruck Road between 54<sup>th</sup> and 68<sup>th</sup> Streets from gravel to a paved road. The specific portion I would like to pave is the stretch of Wittstruck Road starting at 54<sup>th</sup> Street and extending to the driveway accessing Lots 16 SW, Lot 17 and Lots 18 SE in Section 9, Township 8, Range 7 of the 6<sup>th</sup> Principal Meridian:



The improvements I am seeking would consist of a fully paved roadway meeting minimum standards for a rural section county road in Lancaster County.

I submit that this paving is necessary for both safety and maintenance reasons. This section of Wittstruck Road feeds two, large-scale residential developments containing a total of 37 residential dwellings. As a result, there has been a significant influx of traffic on the roadway that has overwhelmed scheduled maintenance. # Impact on Budget

\$ 80,000 increased funding from City/County needed to balance operational budget.

Space costs divided between Lancaster County and City.

- 50/50 for Senior Center
- 10/90 for all other

Debt Service on COPs expected to be \$ 112,000 in first year. COPs will be over a 20-year period.

### Funding

COPS (City Council Approved) \$1,916,000
Internal Borrowing pending sell of 1005 O St.
TIFF (already committed) \$1,500,000
Foundations/Donations \$122,000

### Update on lease terms

- Between City of Lincoln and Victory Park LLC
- 20-Year lease, renewable for 2 additional terms of 10 years
- Rent free
- City responsible for maintenance/repair of facilities, portion of shared cost of Common Area Maintenance or any share of utilities. Attempting to directly connect utilities.
- \$3.5M renovation cost

### Selling of 1005 O Street

- Purchased by City and County for use as Senior Center
- Jointly owned by City and County
- Legal is working on process needed
- Appraisal exceeds \$ 2M
- Apply proceeds of sale to Victory Park facility, pay off internal borrowing of \$ 1,500,000 and apply balance to COPs repayment as needed.
